FOOD SERVICES MANAGEMENT

The school system shall operate a school meal program in its schools which shall be under the supervision of the food services director. This program will offer breakfast before the start of the school day and lunches mid day.

Food services shall include hot lunches, through participation in the National School Lunch Program, and supplemental foods necessary to meet the school day nutritional needs of students.

The food services director shall cooperate with school principals in matters essential to the proper functioning of the food service program. The responsibility for control of students using the cafeterias shall rest with the building principals.

The Board shall approve the prices set for school breakfast & lunch and the price of milk.

As required for participation in the National School Lunch Program, the Board agrees to the following regulations:

- 1. That a "Type A" or offer vs serve option lunch be made available for students;
- 2. That free and reduced-price lunches be provided to students who cannot afford to pay the price of the breakfast/lunch.

Students shall also be permitted to bring their lunches from home and to purchase beverages and a la carte items which meet the dietary guidelines of less than 35% calories from fat.
